What is Universal Design?

"The creation of environments and products which are meant to be usable by all people to the greatest extent possible, without the need for adaptation or specialization." Universal Design is intended to ...

- enhance the quality of life for all of us, regardless of age, limitations or ability
- be invisible and non-stigmatizing
- be so intuitive that you don't even think about it or notice it
- improve access while providing safety and comfort

Why is Universal Design Important?

- 1/3 of all Americans have some type of physical or cognitive limitation
- Less than one in ten US homes are designed to accommodate people with physical limitations
- 95% of Americans over 50 years old want to live in their current home as they age – Source: AARP
- We gain peace of mind knowing that we and our loved ones are safe and happy in their home

Why Consider Universal Design?




